20 August 1840 Committed for trial for stealing 7 sovereigns and some silver.<sup>5</sup>

Newspaper report:

COMMITMENT. – On Thursday last, Elizabeth Bell and Susannah Rawcliffe, two women of disreputable character, were committed for trial at the sessions, for stealing seven sovereigns and some silver from a foolish old countryman, who has been in their company. The whole of

the money had been spent by the prisoners in clothing.<sup>5</sup>

28 August 1840 Tried at Lancaster Quarter Sessions, Preston, Lancashire, England with shipmate

Susannah Rawcliffe (qv) indicted for larceny in stealing 7 sovereigns and some silver

from the person of Richard Fairclough;6 sentence 10 years transportation.7

5 April 1841 Departed Woolwich, England on the *Rajah*.8

19 July 1841 Arrived at Hobart on the *Rajah*.8

c24 July 1841 Upon arrival at Hobart, detained on board for assignment; assigned to Government

House.9

31 December 1841 Mustered in the service of Mr Reichenberg, Davey Street, Hobart. 10

22 July 1842 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart on the complaint of Constable Hadfield with

absconding from the service of Mr Reichenberg on 19 July and remaining illegally at large until she surrendered this morning; plea guilty; sentence 3 months at the wash

tub at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart.<sup>11</sup>

## Elizabeth Bell

28 September 1842	Remainder of punishments and sentence remitted by the Lieutenant Governor, to be returned to the service of Mr Reichenberg, her former master. <sup>12</sup>
7 August 1843	Charged at the Police Court, Hobart on the complaint of her master Mr Reichenberg with being insolent on Saturday 5 August; plea guilty; reprimanded and returned to the service of the Crown for assignment. <sup>13</sup>
11 April 1844	Classified as a 3 <sup>rd</sup> class probation pass-holder; gazetted 12 April. <sup>14</sup>
16 August 1844	Hired in private service as a probation pass-holder to Alfred Garrett, New Town Road, Hobart. <sup>15</sup>
7 September 1844	Hired in private service as a probation pass-holder to Alfred Garrett, New Town, transferred for 6 months to Mr John Hartridge, Davey Street, Hobart. 16
6 March 1845	Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by Constable Smith with being out after hours in a disorderly house last night from the service of Mr John Hartridge; plea guilty; sentence 2 months hard labour at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart. <sup>17</sup>
7 March 1845	Ticket of Leave granted; gazetted 11 March. <sup>18</sup>
6 January 1847	Charged with misconduct; sentence 3 months hard labour at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart. <sup>12</sup>
11 June 1847	Application for permission to marry Charles Harris (free) sent to the Secretary; approved. <sup>19</sup>
12 June 1847	Notice given of approval for permission to marry Charles Harris; Elizabeth a ticket-of-leave holder, resident of Longford; Charles free, resident of Longford. <sup>20</sup>
15 April 1848	Application for permission to marry William Crabtree <sup>21</sup> (free) sent to the Secretary; approved. <sup>22</sup>
24 April 1848	Notice given of approval for permission to marry William Crabtree; Elizabeth a ticket-of-leave holder, resident of the Morven district; William free, resident of the Morven district. <sup>23</sup>
6 May 1848	<b>Married</b> William Crabtree at St Andrew's Anglican Church, Evandale; Elizabeth aged 25, a ticket-of-leave holder, illiterate; William aged 34, free; witnesses shipmate Elizabeth Ayliffe $(qv)^{24}$ and George Powell. <sup>25</sup>
9 April 1850	<b>Daughter</b> Harriet Crabtree born at Evandale; mother Elizabeth Bell; informant father William Crabtree, labourer, resident of Evandale. <sup>26</sup>
16 August 1850	Husband William Crabtree departed Launceston for Melbourne as a passenger on the steamer <i>Shamrock</i> ; a conditional-pardon holder, ship to colony <i>Moffatt</i> . <sup>27</sup>
3 September 1850	Certificate of Freedom issued. <sup>12</sup>
19 February 1852	Departed Launceston for Melbourne with husband William Crabtree and one child, as steerage passengers on the steamer <i>Shamrock</i> ; Elizabeth free by servitude, ship to colony <i>Rajah</i> , William free, ship to colony <i>Raven</i> , <sup>28</sup> child born in the colonies. <sup>29</sup>

## Notes

- Elizabeth's husband may be the William Crabtree who died of disease of the stomach at Launceston on 30 March 1869, aged 45, farmer; informant undertaker Thomas J Doolan; buried in the parish of St Paul, Launceston on 31 March 1869.<sup>47</sup>
- Elizabeth may be the Elizabeth Crabtree who died of consumption at Longford on 7 August 1877, aged 60, widow, resident of Longford; informant Charles Wright, undertaker's son, Longford.<sup>48</sup> She was buried at Christ Church Anglican Cemetery, Longford on 10 August 1877.<sup>49</sup>
