20 April 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 9am. ²
8 September 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for bronchitis (off 14 September, cured). ³
29 May 1850	Tried at Hobart PC, in service to Susannah Wright, Church St, Hobart, charged with misconduct in being out after hours at 12:30am & representing herself to be free; sentence 1m HL, Cascades FF. ⁴
22 July 1850	Tried at Hobart PC charged with absence without leave from the service of Susannah Wright, Church St, Hobart from 19 to 21 July & misconduct in falsely representing herself to be a free woman & being found in bed with a Ticket-of-Leave man in a common brothel at 11:30pm; ^d sentence 8m HL, Cascades FF, half that time to be passed in the separate apartments & recommended she be sent into the interior. ⁴
13 February 1852	To Brickfields Hiring Depot, Hobart. ⁵
16 February 1852	To Joseph Hills, Hamilton. ⁵
18 February 1852	Absconded in Hobart from the service of Mrs Joseph Hills of Hamilton. ⁶
25 February 1852	Tried at Hobart PC charged with absence without leave from the service of Mrs Joseph Hills, Hamilton when in Hobart from 16 February until apprehended; sentence 9m HL, Cascades FF, recommended that every alternate month be passed in the separate apartments & that she be hired in the interior. ⁴
27 February 1852	Charged at Cascades FF with not performing her work; sentence 3d bread & water. ⁷
23 April 1852	Charged at Cascades FF with disorderly conduct; sentence separate treatment until further orders. ⁷
22 June 1852	Charged at Cascades FF with loud talking & disorderly conduct; sentence 3d bread & water. ⁷
12 August 1852	Charged at Cascades FF with using profane language; sentence 2d bread & water. ⁷

^b Mary Ann is listed on the Irish transportation index, with a transportation sentence of 10 years, but no ship is given. No record of her arriving in VDL has been found.

20 November 1852	To John Halstead, Sorell Pittwater. ⁵
3 December 1852	Absconded from the service of John Halstead, Sorell. ⁸
9 December 1852	Tried at Hobart PC, brought up from 6 December on remand, charged with absconding on 26 November from Mr Drury ^e whilst on pass, being about to be sent from Hobart to the service of John Halstead, Sorell & remaining at large until apprehended on 4 December in the house of Susannah Wright, Church St, Hobart; sentence 18m HL. ⁴
December 1852	1s paid into Savings Bank whilst at Cascades FF. ⁹
6 February 1853	To Cascades FF; allowed to enter service in Hobart. ⁵
5 January 1854	To Nigel Gresley, Passage Point. ⁵
3 March 1854	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁵
14 March 1854	Contracted as PPH to John Davis, Pontville, 12m at £9 pa. ¹⁰
10 April 1854	Tried at Brighton PC charged by her master John Davis with being drunk on Saturday last; sentence 1m HL, Cascades FF, not to be returned to her service. ¹¹
14 April 1854	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁵
12 May 1854	To William Smith, Bothwell. ⁵
27 June 1854	Tried at Brighton PC charged, whilst en route to Cascades FF, with misconduct in being violent & disorderly; reprimanded. ¹¹
29 June 1854	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁵
30 November 1854	To Arthur Perry, Battery Point. ⁵
14 December 1854	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁵
15 December 1854	Charged with disorderly conduct in her master's house; sentence 9m HL. ⁵
16 December 1854	Not to enter service in the district of Hobart. ⁵
28 June 1855	To John White, Bothwell. ⁵
13 September 1855	Tried at Bothwell PC charged with having been absent without leave from the premises of her master John White on 12 September; admonished. ¹² Charged also with drunkenness on 12 September; sentence 10d SC. ¹²
27 September 1855	To James Macdonald, Bothwell. ⁵
25 October 1855	To Robert Evans, Pontville. ⁵
20 November 1855	Tried at Brighton PC charged by her master Robert Evans with misconduct in being out after hours last night at 11pm; admonished & returned to her service. ¹³
28 November 1855	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁵
7 December 1855	To Robert Blyth, Sorell. ⁵
9 January 1856	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁵
22 January 1856	To apply in 2 months for Ticket-of-Leave. ⁵
29 April 1856	Ticket-of-Leave granted. ⁵
cMay 1856	To Mr or Mrs Jenkins; pass to Hobart. ¹⁴
30 September 1856	Application for permission to marry John McLoughlin (<i>Governor Phillip</i>). ¹⁵
16 November 1856	Married as 28y, TL, spinster, to John McLoughlin, 45y, TL, farmer, at Franklin RC Church; witnesses Adam Millar & Ellen Williams. ¹⁶
20 November 1856	Sponsor with husband John McLoughlin at baptism of Martha Millar, parents Adam Millar & Ellen Williams. ¹⁷
21 November 1856	Husband John McLoughlin charged at Franklin PO with assaulting his wife; sentence 6m HL, recommended his Ticket-of-Leave be revoked. ¹⁸
2 December 1856	Charged with being out after hours, TL; sentence 7d HL. ⁵
15 December 1856	Tried at Hobart PC charged with being drunk in a public street in Hobart on 13 December 1856; fined £1. ¹⁹

15 January 1857	Husband John McLoughlin charged with misconduct; sentence 7d SC. ¹⁸
19 February 1857	Husband John McLoughlin to Impression Bay Probation Station. ¹⁸
14 April 1857	Husband John McLoughlin's Ticket-of-Leave restored on condition he treats his wife well. ¹⁸
20 May 1857	Tried at Esperance PC with Mary Hooper & Christina Brown charged with being drunk at Port Esperance on 13 May; fined £1. ²⁰
2 December 1857	Tried at Hobart PC charged with misconduct in being out after hours at 11pm last night; sentence 7d HL. ²¹
26 June 1858	Tried at Esperance PC charged with being drunk at Port Esperance on 8 June; fined 10s, or in default 24h SC. ²⁰ Charged John Lomas at Esperance PC with assaulting her on 15 May; witness with her husband John McLoughlin. ²²
31 July 1858	Husband John McLoughlin charged at Esperance PC with unlawfully absenting himself from his hired service on or about 20 June; charged by Elizabeth Lomas, wife & agent of John Lomas, timber dealer, Port Esperance; adjourned till 20 August. ²³
5 January 1859	Husband John McLoughlin charged with John Anderson at Esperance PC with illegally cutting timber at Police Point on 30 December 1858, value 1s, property of George Willis Nichol, with intent to steal same; fined £1 each & 7/6 costs, in default 1m HL. ²³
8 January 1859	Free by servitude.
15 February 1859	Husband John McLoughlin's Ticket-of-Leave revoked. ¹⁸
22 August 1860	Daughter Margaret McLoughlin born in Glamorgan district. ²⁴
28 November 1862 ^f	Son John Cornelius McLoughlin born at Ross; baptised 8 February 1863 in Campbell Town district; parents living at Ross; sponsors Henry Scully & Catherine Walter (nee Reidy, <i>qv</i>). ^{25,26}
3 November 1885	Son John Cornelius McLoughlin married Adeline Osbourne at St Paul's CE Church, Chiltern, VIC. ²⁶
1898	Son John Cornelius McLoughlin died at Wagga Wagga, NSW. ²⁷
