13 August 1849 Put on *Australasia* sick list for bronchitis (off 18 August, cured).⁴ 9 May 1850 Sister Mary Harte arrived in VDL, prisoner on the *Earl Grey*.³

4 November 1850 Tried at Hobart PC charged by her mistress Mrs Samuel Barnett, Collins St, Hobart

with being insolent to her on 2 November; sentence 5d SC, returned to her service.⁵

20 January 1851 Tried at Hobart PC charged by her master Samuel Barnett, Collins St, Hobart with

absence without leave from her service from 9pm until 10pm on 19 January & being

insolent to her master; sentence 7d SC, returned to her service.⁵

23 October 1851 Application for permission to marry Thomas Dukes (*Blenheim* 3); referred 31 October

to Constable Wicks for enquiry, 7 November to PM Hobart, 31 October to Revd Dr Fry as to death of Dukes' wife & death of her husband (approved 10 January 1852).⁶

2 December 1851 Tried at Hobart PC charged by her mistress Mrs Samuel Barnett, Collins St, Hobart

with misconduct; discharged to her service, no persons appearing to prosecute.⁵

8 January 1852 Tried at Hobart PC charged by her mistress Mrs Samuel Barnett, Collins St, Hobart

with larceny under the value of £5 in having feloniously stolen a blanket, the

property of her mistress; discharged to the service of the Crown, to Brickfields Hiring

Depot, there being no case.⁵

9 January 1852 To JM Short, Collins St, Hobart.⁷

applications 5 March 1852, 3rd application 20 April 1852).9

9 November 1852 Ticket-of-Leave granted.⁷

11 December 1852 Daughter Mary Ann Dukes born; baptised 26 December 1852 at St Joseph's RC

Church, Hobart; sponsors Patrick Carthy & Mary A O'Brien.¹⁰

June 1853 Mustered in Huon district, resident with husband, Recherche Bay. 11

18 December 1854 Husband Thomas Dukes received Certificate of Freedom. 12

27 February 1856 Free by servitude.

28 February 1856 Certificate of Freedom collected.⁷ c1857 Moved with family to VIC.¹⁴

1870 Daughter Mary Ann Dukes married Michael Kennedy in VIC.¹³

27 December 1893 Died of peritonitis & pneumonia at Yarram, VIC, 87y; buried 29 December at

Greenmount Cemetery, VIC.14

9 July 1894 Probate for will granted. 15
