1 March 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 2pm. <sup>2</sup>
19 April 1852	To Matthew Jackson, Campbell St, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
20 April 1852	To Brickfields Hiring Depot, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
23 April 1852	To Henry Wilkinson, Warwick St, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
30 April 1852	Absconded from the service of Henry Wilkinson, Barrack St, Hobart. <sup>4</sup>
11 May 1852 <sup>b</sup>	Tried at Hobart PC brought up from 8 May on remand at Cascades FF charged with absconding from the service of Henry Wilkinson, Warwick St, Hobart on 30 April & remaining at large until 7 May when apprehended; sentence 8m HL, Cascades FF. <sup>5</sup>
15 May 1852 <sup>c</sup>	Charged at Cascades FF with having a dirty apartment; sentence 2d bread & water. <sup>6</sup>
27 August 1852 <sup>c</sup>	Charged at Cascades FF with talking in the work room; sentence not known. <sup>6</sup>
10 November 1852	To Henry Harburgh, Harrington St, Hobart, late of Goose Island <sup>d,3</sup>
21 December 1852	Ticket-of-Leave granted. <sup>3</sup>
5 July 1853	<b>Son</b> Alfred Haywood, painter's child, born at Hobart; baptised 8 August at St Joseph's RC Church, Hobart; sponsor Margaret Clancy. <sup>7</sup>
29 December 1853	Application for permission to marry Alfred Haywood ( <i>Rodney</i> 2) (approved 3 January 1854 <sup>e</sup> ). <sup>8</sup>
23 January 1854	<b>Married</b> as 26y, spinster, to Alfred Haywood, 23y, painter, at St George's CE Church, Battery Point; witnesses Thomas Collins & Margaret Collins. <sup>9</sup>
16 May 1854	Husband Alfred Haywood granted Conditional Pardon. <sup>10</sup>
30 May 1854	Recommended for Conditional Pardon. <sup>3</sup>
14 June 1854	Husband Alfred Haywood received Certificate of Freedom. <sup>10</sup>
16 August 1854	Husband Alfred Haywood steerage passenger on the <i>Royal Shepherd</i> to Melbourne, with Joseph Taylor ( <i>Rodney</i> ). <sup>11</sup>

26 August 1854	Husband Alfred Haywood, painter & glazier, single, arrived on the <i>City of Hobart</i> as an immigrant <sup>f</sup> from Melbourne. <sup>12</sup>
19 December 1854 <sup>g</sup>	<b>Son</b> John Haywood, painter's child, born at 106 Elizabeth St, Hobart; baptised 31 December at St Joseph's RC Church, Hobart; sponsors John Thompson & Ellen Brian. <sup>13</sup>
3 April 1855	Conditional Pardon approved (issued at Hobart 11 April). <sup>14</sup>
2 January 1856	Free by servitude.
4 January 1856	Certificate of Freedom at Hobart (issued 5 January). <sup>3,15</sup>
12 November 1856	Son John Haywood, 2y, painter's child, died of cold at Campbell St, Hobart. <sup>16</sup>
31 August 1857	<b>Daughter</b> Elizabeth Haywood, painter's child, born at Campbell St, Hobart; baptised 25 September at St Joseph's RC Church, Hobart; sponsor Ellen Brown. <sup>17</sup>
1858	Husband Alfred Haywood occupier of a dwelling-house at No. 6 near 99 Campbell St, Hobart; annual value £10. <sup>18</sup>
