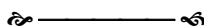

3 March 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 5pm. ²
14 August 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for obstipation (off 19 August, cured). ³
18 September 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for dysentery (off 25 September, cured). ³
2 January 1852	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁴
15 January 1852	To Brickfields Hiring Depot, Hobart. ⁴
29 April 1852	To James Randsley, Fenton Forest. ⁴
29 May 1852	Memorial for Ticket-of-Leave received at New Norfolk PO. ⁵
27 July 1852	Ticket-of-Leave granted. ⁴
6 September 1852	Application for permission to marry Thomas West, FS; ^c referred 23 September to woman, 'has she any objection?'. ⁶
4 December 1852	Resident with Lawless, New Norfolk district. ⁷
5 December 1852	Married as 34y, servant, TL, to Thomas West, 41y, farmer, free, at New Norfolk RC Chapel; witnesses Thomas Horton & Mary Cleary. ⁸
16 December 1853	Resident with husband, New Norfolk district. ⁷
4 August 1855	Tried at New Norfolk PC with Thomas West, FS, Johanna Egan (<i>Duke of Cornwall</i>), William Wheeler, Luke Scanlon, James Tickney, George Fenton, Mary Latham, John Latham & Bridget Galvin charged with drunkenness in a public place on Sunday last, 29 July; each fined £1. ⁹
4 January 1856	Free by servitude.
c1856	Moved with husband to VIC. ¹¹
8 July 1887	Admitted to Creswick Hospital, VIC, 77y, widow, house worker, resident at Smeaton, VIC. ¹⁰
8 November 1889	Died of old age & exhaustion at Ballarat Benevolent Asylum, VIC, 79y; buried 9 November in Ballarat. ¹¹



^a Age given as 32y on *Australasia* sick list.

^b Mother's name taken from Winifred's death certificate, not indent, so her mother is likely to have been dead at the time of her transportation.

^c The most likely of the five convicts named Thomas West transported to VDL to be Winifred's husband was the one transported on the *Sir Charles Forbes*. The next most likely was Thomas West transported on the *Canton*.
