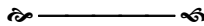

26 February 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 11am. <sup>2</sup>
18 December 1850	Charged at Brickfields Hiring Depot with appropriating a petticoat to her own use; sentence 3m HL, Cascades FF. <sup>3</sup>
1 April 1851	Charged at Cascades FF with disobedience of regulations in talking; admonished, to sleep in separate apartments. <sup>4</sup>
11 April 1851	Charged at Cascades FF with disorderly conduct; sentence 14d separate treatment. <sup>4</sup>
13 October 1851	Charged at Brickfields Hiring Depot with disobedience of orders; sentence 14d SC. <sup>3</sup>
19 September 1854	Ticket-of-Leave granted. <sup>3</sup>
25 October 1854	Tried at Hobart PC charged with misconduct in being in bed with a man at her residence last night, the husband of Sarah Moriarty; sentence 6m HL, Cascades FF, recommended her Ticket-of-Leave be revoked. <sup>3,5</sup>
7 November 1854	Ticket-of-Leave revoked. <sup>3</sup>
12 February 1855	To L Reynolds, PO. <sup>3</sup>
17 April 1855	Charged by her master L Reynolds of Hobart with insolence; sentence 4m HL, Cascades FF. <sup>3</sup>
21 July 1855	To Cascades FF, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
20 July 1855	To Mrs Rundall, Nile Terrace, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
31 July 1855	To Mrs McGuire, PO. <sup>3</sup>
6 August 1855	Charged with absconding; sentence 4m HL, Cascades FF. <sup>3</sup>
3 November 1855	To John Jones, Argyle St, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
22 November 1855	Charged by her master John Jones with being out after hours; sentence 2m HL, Cascades FF. <sup>3</sup>
12 January 1856	To Mr Wilson, Collins St, Hobart. <sup>3</sup>
23 January 1856	Free by servitude.
28 January 1856	Certificate of Freedom. <sup>3</sup>
14 February 1856	Tried at Hobart PC with Mary Ann Douglass charged with using obscene language in a public street in Hobart on 13 February; fined 5s each, in default 7d imprisonment, Cascades Gaol. <sup>6</sup>

<sup>b</sup> Not found on the Irish transportation index, unless it is John Kennedy tried on 25 January 1849 for burglary. He may not have been transported.

- 29 March 1856 Tried at Hobart PC charged with being an idle & disorderly person in being a common prostitute wandering in the streets in Hobart at 11:30pm last night & behaving in an indecent & riotous manner; sentence 1m HL.<sup>6</sup>
- 26 April 1856 Tried at Hobart PC charged by Henry Birchall, a man belonging to a Huon craft, with larceny under £5 in stealing the sum of 7s; discharged, there being no case against her, the prosecutor not appearing.<sup>7</sup>
- 3 April 1857 Tried at Hobart PC charged with using obscene language in a public street in Hobart on 2 April 1857; sentence 5d SC & fined 5s.<sup>8</sup>
- 28 January 1862 Tried at Hobart SC with Sophia Murphy charged with stealing in the dwelling house of John Overell £16, the monies of James Haler;<sup>c</sup> sentence 6y HL, Cascades Gaol (discharged w/e 3 October 1866).<sup>9</sup>
- September 1864 Six pence forfeited at Cascades Gaol.<sup>10</sup>
- 20 November 1867 Tried at Hobart for prostitution, also recorded as being idle & disorderly; sentence 3m HL, Cascades Gaol (discharged w/e 12 February 1868).<sup>11</sup>
