Husband Charles Ingram occupier of an agricultural farm (100 acres) at Jerusalem. ¹⁴

7 October 1865 Husband Charles Ingram, 64y, farmer, died of dropsy at Kangaroo River near

Richmond.15

28 August 1866 Tried at Richmond PC with Margaret Leper^f (Midlothian) charged with having on 19

August feloniously broken into a dwelling house on the premises of William & John Iles of White Kangaroo River & stealing therefrom 1 cotton rug & 1 blanket, value 6/6, property of John Fulford; remanded to Richmond till 29 August for further

examination.16

6 April 1868 Married as 50y, general servant, widow, to Charles Kehoe, 36y, sawyer, bachelor, at

Tunnack, RC ceremony; witnesses George Adams & Elizabeth McAuliffe.¹⁷
