

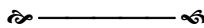

<i>Family</i> cousins Margaret & Mary Whelan	
20 December 1848	Petition to Lord Lieutenant of Ireland for sentence of transportation to be overturned; sentence to stand. <sup>2</sup>
23 February 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 2pm. <sup>3</sup>
4 September 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for obstipation (off 10 September, cured). <sup>4</sup>
17 September 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for obstipation (off 20 September, cured). <sup>4</sup>
27 May 1850	Contracted as PPH to Thomas Ball, Macquarie St, Hobart, 12m at £7 pa. <sup>5</sup>
27 September 1850	Contracted as PPH to Andrew Robertson, Hamilton, 12m at £9 pa. <sup>6</sup>
7 October 1850	Contracted as PPH to Dennis White, Hamilton, 12m at £9 pa. <sup>6</sup>
15 October 1850	Application for permission to marry Patrick Kelly ( <i>Corsair</i> ) (approved 21 October). <sup>7</sup>
11 November 1850	<b>Married</b> as spinster, PPH, to Patrick Kelly, bachelor, TL, at St Stephen's RC Church, Hamilton; witnesses John Reed & Elizabeth White. <sup>8</sup>
c1852	<b>Son</b> James Kelly born. <sup>19</sup>
March 1852	Ordered not to reside in Launceston, Hobart, or south of Brighton. <sup>9</sup>
20 May 1852	Mustered in Hamilton district. <sup>10</sup>
8 June 1852	Ticket-of-Leave granted. <sup>10</sup>
June 1852	Mustered in Hamilton district, resident with husband at Hamilton. <sup>11</sup>
25 August 1852	Tried at Hamilton PC charged by James Jackson with misconduct in using abusive language to him on 24 August; pleaded guilty stating, 'Mr Jackson turned round like a dog to bite me & I abused him'; reprimanded. <sup>12</sup>
December 1852	Mustered in Hamilton district, residence Woolpack. <sup>11</sup>
11 March 1853	Resident with Captain Haton[?], New Norfolk district. <sup>9</sup>
21 June 1853	Husband Patrick Kelly granted Conditional Pardon. <sup>13</sup>
17 July 1853	Mustered in Hamilton district. <sup>10</sup>
10 April 1855	To Hamilton. <sup>9</sup>
c1855	<b>Son</b> Thomas Kelly born. <sup>19</sup>
June 1855	Mustered in Hamilton district, resident with husband at Hamilton. <sup>11</sup>
31 October 1855	Free by servitude.

7 November 1855 c1857	Certificate of Freedom to Hamilton. <sup>10</sup> <b>Son</b> Henry Kelly born. <sup>19</sup>
5 November 1858	<b>Daughter</b> Hannah Kelly born; baptised 12 December 1858 at St Joseph's RC Church, Hobart; sponsors James Quigley & Hannah Barry. <sup>14</sup>
18 August 1861	<b>Son</b> Patrick Kelly, horse breaker's child, born at Hamilton. <sup>15</sup>
21 August 1863	Husband Patrick Kelly committed highway robbery near Hamilton. <sup>16</sup>
22 August 1863	<b>Son</b> Timothy Kelly, horse breaker's child, born at Hamilton. <sup>17</sup>
29 October 1863	Husband Patrick Kelly tried at Hobart SC charged with robbery under arms; sentence death, commuted to 10y penal servitude at Port Arthur. <sup>18</sup>
November 1863	Application approved for children James Kelly, Thomas Kelly & Henry Kelly to be admitted to Queen's Orphanage, New Town; 8s per week reduced to 5s <sup>c</sup> . <sup>19</sup>
28 April 1865	Application approved for 2 children to be admitted to Queen's Orphanage, New Town. <sup>19</sup>
4 November 1868	Son Thomas Kelly apprenticed to William O'Brien, Long River. <sup>20</sup>
24 December 1868	Husband Patrick Kelly discharged to freedom. <sup>21</sup>
31 December 1868	Husband Patrick Kelly granted Free Pardon. <sup>13</sup>
1869	Application approved for children Hannah Kelly & Thomas Kelly to be discharged from Queen's Orphanage, New Town. <sup>22</sup>
8 March 1869	Daughter Hannah Kelly, 9y 7m, & son Henry Kelly, 11y 6m, discharged from Queen's Orphanage, New Town to their father. <sup>23</sup> Apprenticeship of son Thomas Kelly transferred to his father (apprenticeship expired 6 January 1874). <sup>20</sup>
29 August 1887	Daughter Hannah Kelly married William Dalton at Holy Redeemer RC Church, Deloraine. <sup>24</sup>
17 June 1890 <sup>d</sup>	Application for outdoor relief by husband Patrick Kelly; 2/6 per week suggested. <sup>18</sup>
14 April 1894	Husband Patrick Kelly admitted to Launceston Hospital. <sup>13</sup>
25 April 1894	Husband Patrick Kelly, 80y, labourer, died of inflammation of the bladder. <sup>25</sup>
2 October 1901	<b>Died</b> at the residence of son-in-law William Dalton, Parsonage, Deloraine, 73y; buried 4 October at Holy Redeemer RC Church Cemetery, Deloraine. <sup>26</sup>
