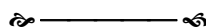

15 September 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for dysentery (off 25 September, cured). ³		
25 January 1851	Contracted as PPH to Richard Drury, Liverpool St, Hobart, 12m at £7 pa. ⁴		
31 March 1851	Contracted as PPH to Robert William Carns, New Town, 12m at £9 pa. ⁴		
2 July 1851	Application for permission to marry Frederick Spencer, free; referred 8 July to PM Hobart, 4 July to Superintendent, Brickfields Hiring Depot & 18 July to woman. ⁵		
13 November 1851	Contracted as PPH to Edward Galway, Liverpool St, Hobart, 12m at £7 pa. ⁶		
14 January 1852	To Brickfields Hiring Depot, Hobart. ⁷		
19 January 1852	To Ross FF. ⁷		
May 1852	To John Duxberry, Stony Creek, near Campbell Town. ⁸		
18 May 1852	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged by her master John Duxberry with misconduct in being out of her bedroom at 12 o'clock on Saturday night & being found in the laundry on her master's premises with Thomas Westlake for immoral purposes; sentence 6m HL, Ross FF. ⁹		
	Husband-to-be Thomas Westlake tried at Campbell Town PC with misconduct in having Eliza Kenny in the laundry, etc for immoral purposes; sentence 7d SC. ¹⁰		
7 June 1852	Application for permission to marry Thomas Westlake (<i>Ratcliffe</i> 2); referred 7 June to PM Campbell Town. ¹¹		
23 July 1852	Charged at Ross FF with idleness, etc; sentence 10d SC. ⁷		
27 August 1852	Charged at Ross FF with fighting; existing sentence extended 3m. ⁷		
21 September 1852	Charged at Ross FF with damaging her new shoes; sentence 7d SC. ⁷		
15 November 1852	Letter of claim for unpaid wages to CG re John Duxberry. ⁸		
5 December 1852	Application for permission to marry Thomas Westlake (<i>Ratcliffe</i> 2). ¹¹		
31 December 1852	Application for permission to marry Thomas Westlake (<i>Ratcliffe</i> 2) (approved 21 January 1853). ¹¹		
10 January 1853	To Henry Valentine, Ross. ⁷		
19 January 1853	To Ross FF. ⁷

7 February 1853	To Campbell Town to be married. ⁷ Married as 22y, house servant, spinster, to Thomas Westlake, 29y, groom, bachelor, at St Luke's CE Church, Campbell Town; witnesses Charles Hayhoe & Mary Ann Hayhoe. ¹²
29 August 1854	Ticket-of-Leave granted. ⁷
15 September 1854	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with misconduct in being absent from her authorised place of residence all last night; sentence 2m HL, Ross FF. ¹³
21 September 1854	Husband Thomas Westlake tried at Campbell Town PC, brought up from 14 September on remand, charged with larceny under the value of £5 in stealing a leaf of a dining table, value 10s, property of Benjamin Horne, at Ross on 14 September; sentence 12m HL, Impression Bay Probation Station, recommended to be deprived of his Ticket-of-Leave (revoked 17 October 1854). ^{10,14}
12 April 1855	Mustered in Oatlands district. ⁷
4 June 1855	Husband Thomas Westlake to John Lord, Bagdad. ¹⁰
7 August 1855	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with being drunk in a public house (<i>Englebert's</i>) at Campbell Town on 7 August; fined £1, fine paid. ¹⁵
13 August 1855	Absconded from her authorised place of residence at Campbell Town. ¹⁶
18 August 1855	Ticket-of-Leave revoked for misconduct. ¹⁶
11 September 1855	Charged with absconding; sentence 6m HL, Cascades FF. ⁷
28 September 1855	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁷
3 January 1856	Free by servitude.
10 January 1856	Certificate of Freedom at Hobart for collection. ⁷
28 March 1856	Husband Thomas Westlake charged at Richmond with absence; sentence 10d SC. ¹⁰
7 May 1856	Husband Thomas Westlake charged at Richmond with misconduct; sentence 14d HL. ¹⁰
23 September 1856	Husband Thomas Westlake granted Ticket-of-Leave. ¹⁰
November 1857	Husband Thomas Westlake absconded. ¹⁰
29 December 1857	Husband Thomas Westlake's Ticket-of-Leave revoked. ¹⁰
26 January 1858	Husband Thomas Westlake's Ticket-of-Leave restored. ¹⁰
15 June 1858	Husband Thomas Westlake granted Conditional Pardon. ¹⁰
c1859	Husband Thomas Westlake formed a <i>de facto</i> relationship with Mary Ann Young. ^b



^b Thomas and Mary Ann Young had five children born between 1859 and 1869 in Campbell Town and Launceston. No death record has been found for Elizabeth.
