c1821 **Born** in Queens County, Ireland.³

31 August 1840 Tried at Lancaster Sessions of the Peace, Salford, Lancashire, England indicted for receiving a watch; sentence 10 years transportation.⁴

15 September 1840 Imprisoned at the New Bailey Prison, Salford, Lancashire, England in one of ten 3-bed cells, Wards 21–27.⁵

Under medical treatment, out of hospital, for malingering; class T, aged 19.⁶

5 April 1841 Departed Woolwich, England on the *Rajah*.⁷

19 July 1841 Arrived at Hobart on the *Rajah*.⁷

c24 July 1841 Upon arrival at Hobart, sent to Launceston for assignment.⁸

21 September 1841 At Launceston.⁴

13 November 1841 Charged at the Police Court, Evandale with disobedience of orders; in the service of Mr Ralston; plea guilty; sentence 1 month hard labour at Launceston Female Factory, then returned to Government.⁹

28 December 1841 Charged with misconduct in the service of Tobin; sentence 6 months hard labour at Launceston Female Factory.⁴

31 December 1841 Mustered at Launceston Female Factory.¹⁰

13 January 1842 Charged at Launceston Female Factory with disorderly conduct in the Crime Class; sentence 10 days in solitary confinement at Launceston Female Factory.⁴

- 10 June 1842 Charged at the Police Court, Longford by Mr Hortle with absconding this morning from the service of Mr Green; plea guilty; remanded.¹¹
- 11 June 1842 Brought up at the Police Court, Longford charged by her master Mr Green with feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away on 9 June a box containing 2 bank notes of £2 each and 3 of £1 each and silver to the amount of 20 shillings and of the valuable security his property; plea guilty; remanded.¹²
- 13 June 1842 Brought up at the Police Court, Longford charged as before; remanded.¹³
- 15 June 1842 Brought up at the Police Court, Longford charged as before; plea guilty; fully committed for trial.¹⁴
- 28 June 1842 Tried at the Quarter Sessions, Launceston indicted for larceny in stealing in the dwelling house of Mr James Green one box value 10 shillings, and two promissory notes value £3; plea guilty, verdict guilty; sentence 14 years transportation.¹⁵
- 21 July 1842 Charged at the Police Court, Launceston upon complaint of Adam Thompson with misconduct in destroying a table and two mess kids and creating a violent disturbance in the Gaol at Launceston; plea not guilty; verdict guilty; sentence 14 days in solitary confinement, and further specially directed to be kept on bread and water for 7 days of that period from 27 July to 3 August inclusive, at Launceston Female Factory.¹⁶
- Ellen Miles (*Gilbert Henderson*) and Mary Sheriff (*Atwick*) charged with the same offence, same sentence.¹⁶
- Newspaper report:
*Catherine Lowry, Ellen Miles, and Mary Sheriff*¹⁷, three prisoners of the crown, under confinement at the gaol, were charged by the keeper with disorderly conduct in gaol and wilfully breaking their mess kids and a table; they were each sentenced to fourteen days' solitary confinement – seven days of that term on bread and water.¹⁸
- 29 July 1842 At Launceston.⁴
- 24 October 1842 Charged at Launceston Female Factory with insubordination; sentence 2 years imprisonment and hard labour in addition to her existing sentence to hard labour, and to be removed to Cascades Female Factory, Hobart.⁴
- Newspaper report:
FEMALE FACTORY. – A rumpus occurred in this establishment on Thursday, which caused considerable trouble to the authorities. Some refractory women urged on several others to an act of open mutiny, which was quelled on Friday morning by the introduction into the Factory of a gang of Penitentiary men, who broke down the barricades erected by the women, and forced them to submission. The ringleaders, several in number, were conveyed to gaol, where they have shewn symptoms of sad insubordination. In the absence of an investigation, we forbear stating the reputed cause of the outbreak.¹⁹
- 20 February 1843 Charged at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart with disorderly conduct; sentence 10 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart.
- 2 March 1843 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart on the complaint of Mrs Liverpool with misconduct in assaulting her on Thursday 10 February; plea guilty; sentence 3 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart.²⁰

15 May 1844	Classified as a 1 st class probation pass-holder; gazetted 17 May. ²¹
25 May 1844	Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by Constable Harrod with being absent without leave on Friday 24 May and out after hours from the service of Mr Manton, Macquarie Street, Hobart; plea guilty; sentence 2 months hard labour at Cascades Female Factory. ²²
30 May 1844	Hired in private service as a probation pass-holder to Reverend John Manton, Melville Street, Hobart. ²³
8 July 1844	Charged at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart with assaulting Mary A Clapham; sentence 6 months hard labour and recommended to be subjected to the separate system at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart. ⁴
31 July 1844	Hired in private service as a probation pass-holder to John C Macdougall, Hobart. ²⁴
16 December 1844	Residue of her punishment sentence passed in July remitted by the Lieutenant Governor as recommended in a memo from the Comptroller General; directed to be removed to Brickfields Hiring Depot, Hobart. ⁴
10 February 1845	Hired in private service for 12 months as a probation pass-holder to James Hickson, Glenorchy. ²⁵
17 February 1845	Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by Constable Furlage with being absent without leave on Saturday 15 February from the service of Mr Hickson, Glenorchy; plea guilty; sentence 10 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart. ²⁶
4 August 1845	Hired in private service for 12 months as a probation pass-holder to Richard Shoebridge, New Town Road, Hobart. ²⁷
22 August 1845	Promoted from a 1 st class to a 2 nd class probation pass-holder. ²⁸
10 November 1845	Hired in private service for 1 month as a probation pass-holder to Jane Carr, Harrington Street, Hobart. ²⁹
1 December 1845	Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by Constable H Cock with absconding on 18 November from her service and remaining illegally at large until apprehended on 28 November; in the service of Mrs Carr, Hobart; plea guilty; sentence 4 months hard labour at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart. ³⁰
3 June 1846	Application for permission to marry from James Deverell ³¹ (<i>Sir George Seymour</i> , Ticket of Leave) sent to the Secretary; approved. ³²
6 June 1846	Notice given of approval for permission to marry James Deverell (<i>Sir George Seymour</i>); Catherine resident of Hobart; James a ticket-of-leave holder, resident of Hobart. ³³
22 June 1846	Married James Deverell at St George's Anglican Church, Battery Point; Catherine 22, spinster; James 24, labourer; witnesses Henry Debley and Rebecca Whitehead. ³⁴
29 July 1846	Charged with misconduct in being out after hours; sentence 5 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart. ⁴

- Husband James Deverell charged at the Police Court, Hobart with misconduct in resisting a constable in the execution of his duty; admonished.³⁵
- 30 September 1846 Husband James Deverell charged at the Police Court, Hobart with disturbing the public peace and assaulting a constable in the execution of his duty; sentence 2 months imprisonment and hard labour at Oyster Cove.³⁵
- 15 December 1846 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by Constable George Haley with misconduct in being in bed with a Ticket of Leave man last night at her own residence and also with having obtained her living for the last two months by prostitution; sentence 3 months imprisonment and hard labour at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart; 3rd class probation pass-holder, married.³⁶
- Statement in defence:
*I work for my living.*³⁶
- Statement of Constable George Haley:
*I am a constable during the last two months I have frequently seen the prisoner wandering about and in public houses with different men. I have seen her [take them back] to her own house. I always thought the prisoner was a ticket-of-leave holder.*³⁶
- 30 March 1847 Promoted from a 2nd class to a 3rd class probation pass-holder; gazetted 6 April.³⁷
- 1 June 1847 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart with misconduct in being out after hours at ¼ past 12 pm on 30 May; sentence 8 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart; 3rd class probation pass-holder; married.³⁸
- 5 June 1847 **Son** Joseph Deverell born at Argyle Street, Hobart; mother Catherine Lowry; informant father James Deverall, labourer, illiterate.³⁹
- 2 August 1847 Charged with misconduct in the service of her husband; sentence 8 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, Hobart.⁴
- Husband James Deverell charged at the Police Court, Hobart with being out after hours; sentence 6 weeks imprisonment and hard labour at Bridgewater.³⁵
- 10 December 1847 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart with being drunk in the service of her husband, confined by Constable Kennedy; discharged, no prosecutor appearing.⁴⁰
- 1849 **Daughter** Eliza Deverell born.⁴¹
- 19 March 1850 Husband James Deverell absent from muster; Ticket of Leave revoked.³⁵
- 3 April 1850 Application for Ticket of Leave.⁴
- 9 April 1850 Ticket of Leave granted.⁴
- 24 September 1850 Charged with being drunk; fined 5 shillings.⁴
- 18 May 1851 **Daughter** Ann Deverell born.^{42,43}
- 12 August 1851 Daughter Ann Deverell baptised at St John's Anglican Church, Franklin; father James Deverall, labourer.⁴³
- 30 March 1853 Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk and disorderly at Deloraine; plea guilty; fined 5 shillings; aged 30, illiterate.⁴⁴
- Husband James Deverell charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with disturbing the peace at Deloraine; plea guilty; fined 5 shillings; aged 30, illiterate.⁴⁵

- 27 May 1853 Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine by John Chaffy⁴⁶ with felony on 26 May in robbing him of 5 £1 notes in O'Donnell's public house, Deloraine; plea not guilty; remanded to the Police Office, Westbury for further examination; aged 30, illiterate.⁴⁷
- 28 May 1853 Charged at the Police Court, Westbury with larceny of the value of £5 in feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away at Deloraine on 26 May 5 £1 promissory notes of the value of 20 shillings each, the property of John Chaffy; plea not guilty; discharged; aged 30, illiterate.⁴⁸
- 31 May 1853 Husband James Deverell issued a Certificate of Freedom.³⁵
- 18 July 1853 **Son** James Deverell born in the Westbury district; father James Deverell; mother Catherine Deverell.⁴⁹
- 15 November 1853 Husband James Deverell charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with disturbing the peace at Deloraine on 11 November; in the service of Mr J Winter Esquire; no sentence recorded; aged 28, literate.⁵⁰
- 2 December 1853 Son James Deverell died of inflammation of the intestinal canal in the Westbury district; aged 6 months, infant.⁵¹
- 4 April 1854 Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk at Deloraine on 3 April; plea guilty; fined 5 shillings; aged 35, illiterate.⁵²
- 10 May 1854 Charged at the Police Court, Westbury with misconduct in being absent from her service and being drunk; in the service of Mr Winter, Deloraine; fined 5 shillings; aged 33, illiterate.⁵³
- 16 May 1854 Daughter Eliza Deverell died of inflammation of the lungs at Black Forest, Deloraine; aged 5 years; informant father James Deverell, illiterate.⁵⁴
- c1854 Charged with being drunk; fined 5 shillings.⁴
- 4 January 1855 Charged with making use of obscene language; fined 5 shillings.⁴
- 13 April 1855 Charged with being drunk; in the service of West; fined £1.⁴
- 30 April 1855 Charged with being drunk; fined £2.⁴
- 8 June 1855 Charged with being drunk; sentence 1 month's hard labour at Launceston Female Factory.⁴
- 11 June 1855 At Launceston Female Factory.⁴
- 9 July 1855 Discharged to her Ticket of Leave.⁴
- 28 September 1855 Charged with being drunk; fined £3.⁴
- 10 December 1855 **Daughter** Elizabeth (Eliza) Deverell born at Deloraine; mother Catherine Lowry; father James Deverell, farmer; informant not given.⁵⁵
- 9 May 1856 Charged with being drunk; fined 60 shillings.⁴
- 30 May 1856 Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with disturbing the peace on 28 May; plea guilty; fined 5 shillings; aged 36, illiterate.⁵⁶

2 June 1857	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with misconduct in being absent from her authorised place of residence on 1 June; plea guilty; discharged. ⁵⁸

18 March 1858	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk at Deloraine on 16 March; plea guilty; discharged; aged 37, illiterate. ⁵⁹
21 April 1858	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk and incapable of taking care of herself; fined 10 shillings, or in default of payment 24 hours imprisonment. ⁶⁰
19 June 1858	Son James Deverell born at Deloraine; mother Catherine Lowry; informant father James Devrell, sawyer. ⁶¹
22 July 1858	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine by Constable Greentree with being drunk and incapable of taking care of herself in a public place at Deloraine on 21 July; plea guilty; fined 10 shillings or in default 24 hours in solitary confinement; aged 36, illiterate. ⁶²
26 July 1858	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine by District Constable Jones with being an idle and disorderly person not having any visible means of subsistence at Deloraine on 24 July; plea guilty; sentence 3 months imprisonment with hard labour; aged 36, illiterate. ⁶³
25 September 1858	Husband James Deverell applied for a splitter's licence for 4 weeks from 27 September; 10 shillings fee forwarded to the Police Magistrate, Westbury; resident of Reedy Marsh. ⁶⁴
8 February 1859	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine by Constable Blackall with being an idle and disorderly person not having any visible means of subsistence at Deloraine on 7 February; plea guilty; sentence 1 month imprisonment with hard labour; aged 36, illiterate. ⁶⁵
10 November 1859	Husband James Deverell charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk and incapable on 9 November; plea guilty; fined 10 shillings, paid. ⁶⁶
27 December 1859	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk and incapable at Deloraine on 26 December; plea guilty; fined 10 shillings or 24 hours in solitary confinement. ⁶⁷
30 December 1859	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk and disorderly; plea guilty; fined 20 shillings, or in default 3 days in solitary confinement. ⁶⁸
27 April 1860	Charged at the Police Court, Deloraine with being drunk and incapable at Deloraine on 25 April; plea guilty; fined 10 shillings. ⁶⁹
