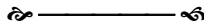

21 May 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 10:30am. <sup>2</sup>
28 January 1850	Contracted as PPH to Edward Lindsay, Battery Point, 1m at £8 pa. <sup>3</sup>
30 December 1850	Application for permission to marry Henry Parker ( <i>Lady Raffles</i> ); referred 31 December to Revd F Brownrigg (approved 28 January 1851). <sup>4</sup>
17 February 1851	<b>Married</b> as full age, spinster, to Henry Parker, full age, constable, <sup>b</sup> at St George's CE Church, Battery Point; witnesses Phillip Allen & M Miller. <sup>5</sup>
12 August 1851	Husband Henry Parker granted Conditional Pardon. <sup>6</sup>
20 August 1851	Tried at Hobart PC charged with disturbing the peace in a public place in Hobart on 19 August & misconduct in being out after hours at about 11pm that night; fined 5s for disturbing the public peace & admonished for being out after hours, being her first offence in the colony, returned to her husband. <sup>7</sup>
13 September 1851	Tried at Hobart PC charged upon complaint of Ellen Johns, Hobart with using abusive language to her on 7 September; complaint dismissed, complainant to pay costs of 14/6. <sup>7</sup>
1 August 1853	Tried at Hobart PC, in service to her husband Henry Parker, Murray St, Hobart, charged with misconduct in being under the influence of liquor & in a public house on the afternoon of 30 July; pleaded guilty of being in the public house only; sentence 6m HL, Cascades FF. <sup>7</sup>
31 December 1853	To her husband Henry Parker, Bathurst St, Hobart. <sup>8</sup>
15 August 1854	Ticket-of-Leave granted. <sup>8</sup>
12 December 1854	Tried at Hobart PC, brought up from 8 December on remand, charged with suspicion of larceny; discharged, no case, ordered to take out a pass for the interior. <sup>9</sup>
26 January 1855	Tried at Hobart PC charged with misconduct in being out after hours on the morning of 25 January at 1am; pleaded guilty of being out after hours, 'but I do not know the time'; sentence 14d HL, Cascades FF. <sup>8,10</sup>
10 April 1855	Recommended for Conditional Pardon. <sup>8</sup>
22 April 1856	Conditional Pardon approved (issued 24 April at Hobart). <sup>11</sup>

<sup>a</sup> Age given as: 21y on Grangegorman prison register and Irish transportation register; 24y on description list.

<sup>b</sup> Henry Parker was not listed on the register of police establishments as a petty constable for Hobart district.

26 April 1856	Tried at Hobart PC charged with obtaining goods by false pretence; discharged, there being no case against her & the prosecutor not appearing. <sup>12</sup>
23 July 1856	Tried at Hobart PC charged with being drunk in a public street in Hobart on 22 July; fined £1, in default 7d imprisonment, Cascades FF. <sup>13</sup>
15 August 1856	Tried at Hobart PC charged with being drunk in a public street in Hobart; fined £3 & to pay costs 2s, in default 14d SC. <sup>13</sup>
2 September 1856	Tried at Hobart PC, brought up from 1 September on remand, charged with larceny under £5 in stealing the sum of £2 on 30 August, the money of Frederick Vernon; <sup>c</sup> discharged. <sup>14</sup>
18 April 1863	Free by servitude.
14 January 1882	Admitted to New Town Invalid Depot from Campbell Town district (discharged 28 December 1886 to police). <sup>15</sup>
27 August 1891 <sup>d</sup>	<b>Died</b> of senile debility at New Town Charitable Institution, 70y, housewife, born England; buried in pauper section, Cornelian Bay Cemetery, Hobart on 29 August. <sup>16</sup>

<sup>c</sup> *The Mercury* newspaper reported that the £2 was stolen from Mrs Brown.

<sup>d</sup> This death has not been confirmed. Even though the record stated Jane was born in England, this may have been an error. If so, then it is highly likely to have been the death of *Australasia* convict Jane Loague 2<sup>nd</sup>.
