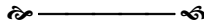

17 May 1848	Sister Catherine (Kitty) Mahony, 20y, country servant, tried at Co. Cork charged with stealing clothes; sentence 7y transportation. ²
20 January 1849	Sister Catherine Mahony arrived in VDL, prisoner on the <i>Lord Auckland</i> 3. ²
1 March 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 2pm. ³
16 July 1850	Mustered in Ross district. ⁴
12 July 1851	Charged by her master Mr Valentine with disobedience of orders & neglect of duty; sentence 4m HL, Ross FF. ⁴
25 October 1851	Mustered in Ross district. ⁴
3 January 1852	To James Soper, Ross. ⁴
16 January 1852	Application for permission to marry Henry Ingledew, free ^c (approved 28 January). ⁵
8 March 1852	Married as 24y, house servant, to Henry Ingledew, 28y, cook, at St Luke's CE Church, Campbell Town; witnesses George Paice & Catherine Paice. ⁶
20 April 1852	To Ross FF. ⁴
4 May 1852	To H Morrison, Campbell Town. ⁴
18 May 1852	To Anthony R Truro, Campbell Town. ⁴
21 July 1852	To Ross FF. ⁴
2 August 1852	To Adam Jackson, Ross. ⁴
18 August 1852	Mustered in Campbell Town district. ⁴
24 August 1852	Charged at Ross FF with insolence; sentence 2m HL, Ross FF. ⁴
27 August 1852	Charged at Ross FF with fighting, existing sentence extended 3m. ⁴
7 September 1852	To apply in 2 months for Ticket-of-Leave. ⁴
10 September 1852	To William Brown, Collins St, Hobart. ⁴
12 October 1852	Mustered in Morven district. ⁴
15 October 1852	To Cascades FF, Hobart. ⁴
20 December 1852	To Robert Harrison, Woodbury. ⁴

^b This information was provided on the indent of sister Catherine (Kitty).

^c This was possibly Henry Ingledew transported on the *Emerald Isle* in 1842.

November 1853	Ticket-of-Leave granted. ⁷
10 June 1854	Mustered at Longford, single, ^d resident with James Allen, <i>Cressy Hotel</i> , Cressy. ⁷
4 December 1854	Mustered at Longford, single, resident with James Allen, <i>Cressy Hotel</i> , Cressy. ⁷
15 February 1856	Free by servitude.
26 February 1856	Certificate of Freedom to Longford. ⁴
13 May 1857	Husband Henry Ingledew married ^e Mary Troy at St Joseph's RC Church, Launceston. ⁸



^d This would suggest that Mary had separated from Henry Ingledew by this time.

^e From Henry's re-marriage it can be assumed that Mary had either died or separated from Henry by this time (and seems to have been for some time). No death or burial for Mary has been found.
