<p>6 April 1849</p>	<p>Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 4pm.²</p>
<p>23 September 1849</p>	<p>Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for obstipation (off 27 September, cured).³</p>
<p>2 September 1850</p>	<p>Tried at Hobart PC charged upon complaint of her master Charles Trapps, Sandy Bay with being drunk, using indecent language & being absent without leave from her service on 1 September from 1pm until 7pm; sentence 7d SC.⁴</p>
<p>22 November 1850</p>	<p>Tried at Hobart PC charged by her master Charles Trapps of Sandy Bay with absence without leave from her service the whole of the night of 21 November & being drunk; discharged to her service, no prosecutor appearing.⁴</p>
<p>5 December 1850</p>	<p>Tried at Hobart PC, in service to Charles Trapps of Sandy Bay, charged with being drunk & misconduct in being out after hours at 9pm last night at Sandy Bay; sentence 6d SC, then returned to her service.⁴</p>
<p>20 December 1850</p>	<p>Tried at Hobart PC charged with absence without leave from the service of Mr Warn, Macquarie St, Hobart from 11am until 9pm on 19 December; sentence 1m HL, Cascades FF.⁴</p>
<p>4 June 1851</p>	<p>Contracted as PPH to William Bumford, Bathurst St, Hobart, 12m at £7 pa.⁵</p>
<p>25 October 1851</p>	<p>Mustered in Ross district.⁶</p>
<p>11 February 1852</p>	<p>To Henry C Adams, Campbell Town.⁶</p>
<p>15 October 1852</p>	<p>Mustered in Morven district.⁶</p>
<p>9 November 1852</p>	<p>Ticket-of-Leave granted.⁶</p>
<p>17 January 1853</p>	<p>Charged with being drunk; fined 5s.⁶</p>
<p>24 September 1853</p>	<p>Charged with using indecent language; fined 5s.⁶</p>
<p>30 October 1854</p>	<p>Charged with being drunk; fined 5s.⁶</p>
<p>22 January 1855</p>	<p>Charged with disturbing the peace; fined 5s.⁶</p>
<p>22 February 1855</p>	<p>Charged with using indecent language & being disorderly; sentence 10d SC, Launceston FF.⁶</p>
<p>17 March 1856</p>	<p>Free by servitude.</p>

^a Offence given as embezzlement on Irish transportation register.

^b Age given as 22y on Grangegorman prison register and Irish transportation register.

5 November 1857

Tried at Brighton PC charged with being drunk in a public place at Pontville on 4 November; fined £1 to be paid immediately, in default 7d SC, Pontville Gaol.

Charged also with having on 4 November offended against decency by exposing her person in a public place at Pontville; fined £5, in default 2m HL, Cascades Gaol.⁷
