c1824 **Born** at Tottenham Court Road, London, Middlesex, England; father William Perry; mother Hannah.²

19 October 1840 Tried at the Central Criminal Court (Old Bailey), London, England with shipmate Eliza Riley³ (*qv*) indicted for larceny in stealing on 21 September 1840 1 pewter pot value 1/3, the property of Thomas Sanders, publican, Wimpole Street; 2 pewter pots value 26, the property of James Hobbs, publican, Weymouth Street; and 2 pewter pots value 2/6, the property of George Hart, publican, Blandford Street, Manchester Square, London; found guilty; sentence 7 years transportation.⁴

Statement of witness William Horsford:

I am a constable. On the 21st of September I saw the two prisoners together in Wimpole-street – I followed them to Baker-street, and I saw Perry take a pint pot from No. 19 – Ryley was close to her, and joined her – I then caught Perry, and took from her the pint pot – I asked what she was going to do – she made no reply – I then took Ryley, and from her apron took four more pots – these are them.⁴

Statement of witness Thomas Sanders:

I am a publican, in Wimpole-street. One of these pots is mine.⁴

Statement of witness James Hobbs:

I keep a public-house in Weymouth-street. These two pots are mine – we lose a great many pots.⁴

Statement of witness George Hart:

I am a publican in Blandford-street, Manchester-square, Two of these pots are mine.⁴

Statement of defendant Hannah Perry:

We had nothing to do; the pots were in the street; it is our first offence.⁴

5 April 1841 Departed Woolwich, England on the *Rajah*.⁵

19 July 1841 Arrived at Hobart on the *Rajah*.⁵

c24 July 1841 Upon arrival at Hobart, sent to Launceston for assignment.⁶

- 21 September 1841 At Launceston.⁷
- 11 November 1841 Charged at Launceston Female Factory with disorderly conduct in fighting; sentence 7 days in solitary confinement at Launceston Female Factory.⁷
- 31 December 1841 Mustered at Launceston Female Factory.⁸
- 1 March 1842 Charged with absconding from the service of her master Mr Beeraff;⁹ her original term of transportation extended 12 months.⁷
- 30 May 1842 **Son** John Perry,¹⁰ illegitimate, born at Launceston Female Factory; mother Hannah Perry; informant Robert Pearson, Superintendent, Launceston Female Factory.¹¹
- 28 June 1842 Reported to have been delivered of an illegitimate child at Launceston Female Factory, vide memorandum of the Assistant Superintendent of Convicts.⁷
- 14 February 1843 Son John Perry died of diarrhoea at Launceston Female Factory; aged 10 months, mother Hannah Perry, prisoner; informant Robert Pearson, Superintendent, House of Correction.¹²
- 16 February 1843 Inquest held into the death of son John Perry.¹³
Newspaper report:
AN INQUEST was held on Thursday last, before P. A. Mulgrave, Esq., on view of the body of a child named John Perry, who died in the factory on the previous Tuesday evening.
Dr. Maddox – Deceased was born in the factory nine months ago, and was healthy until the 28th ultimo, when he was attacked with diarrhoea, from which he died on the 14th inst.; I attended deceased twice a day, and frequently consulted Dr. Benson on his case; the usual medicines were administered, and he had nutritive diet; his mother and nurse were very attentive to him.
Hannah Perry – The deceased (my child) was born in the factory on the 30th May last; about three weeks ago he was attacked with purging; he was regularly attended by Drs. Maddox and Benson; medicines were administered to him, and the warm bath and leeches applied; he had beef tea, arrowroot, and wine; he died on the 14th instant.
Ann Henniker – Have nursed the deceased in the factory for the last seven weeks, during which time he has been suffering under a violent purging; he was regularly attended by Drs. Maddox and Benson, and had medicines, nutritive diet, and a warm bath; the room in which he was kept was airy.
*Verdict – Died by the visitation of God.*¹³
- 11 September 1843 Charged with absconding from the service of Buckley; original sentence of transportation extended 3 months, and to be placed on probation for 6 weeks at the wash tub at Launceston Female Factory.⁷
- 7 April 1844 Ordered to serve further probation from this date previous to being classified.⁷
- 1 September 1844 **Daughter** Jane Perry born at Launceston Female Factory; mother Hannah Perry, prisoner; informant William Lavender, Superintendent, Launceston Female Factory.^{14,27}
- 2 November 1844 Classified as a 2nd class probation pass-holder; gazetted 5 November.¹⁵
- 16 November 1844 At Launceston.⁷
- 5 December 1844 Ticket of Leave granted; gazetted 10 December.¹⁶
- c1845 **Married** William Hollioak¹⁷ at Hobart; Hannah aged 20.²⁷

19 June 1846	Daughter Mary Ann Hollioak ¹⁸ born at Launceston; father William Hollyhock, resident of Wellington Street, Launceston; mother Hannah Perry; informant Mary Ann Smith, resident of Launceston. ¹⁹
19 January 1849	Free by servitude. ⁷
1849	Moved with her family from Tasmania to Victoria. ²⁰

23 May 1873	Admitted to Ballarat Hospital, VIC; aged 49, married, born London, resident of Golden Point, VIC. ²⁶
6 July 1873	Died of angina pectoris at Ballarat District Hospital, VIC; aged 49, born London, England; father William Perry, farmer; mother Hannah Perry; 22 years in Victoria; children Jane dead, William aged 27, Sarah aged 22, Margaret aged 20, Mary Ann aged 16, Henry aged 11 ; informant daughter Margaret Hollioak, seamstress, resident of Ballarat. ²⁷
9 July 1873	Buried at Ballarat Cemetery, VIC. ²⁷
14 August 1876	Husband William Hollioak died at Ballarat, VIC; aged 75, born Shropshire, father William Hollioak; mother Margaret Hollioak. ²⁸
16 August 1876	Husband William Hollioak buried in Section 7 Grave 2 at the Old Cemetery, Ballarat, VIC; aged 75. ²⁹
3 May 1876	Daughter Margaret Hollioak married William Herbert Boykett at Ballarat, VIC; William born London, England. ³⁰
12 July 1878	Granddaughter Hannah Boykett born at Ballarat, VIC; father William Boykett; mother Margaret Hollyoak. ³¹

- 1907 Son William Hollioak died at Bendigo, VIC; aged 65; father William Hollioak; mother Hannah Perry.⁵¹
