1 March 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 2pm. <sup>2</sup>
20 September 1849	Put on <i>Australasia</i> sick list for rheumatism (off 3 October, sent to <i>Anson</i> ). <sup>3</sup>
1850	To Simeon Benjamin, Liverpool St, Hobart. <sup>4</sup>
21 September 1850	Letter of claim for unpaid wages to CG re Simeon Benjamin. <sup>4</sup>
31 January 1851	Contracted as PPH to Thomas Ball, Macquarie St, Hobart, 12m at £7 pa. <sup>5</sup>
1 April 1851	Contracted as PPH to William P Dowling, Harrington St, Hobart, 12m at £7 pa. <sup>5</sup>
8 August 1851	Contracted as PPH to John Lloyd, Huon, 12m at £7 pa. <sup>6</sup>
10 May 1852	<b>Married</b> as 22y, servant, spinster, to Charles Livingstone ( <i>Lord Petre</i> ), 34y, labourer, bachelor, at St John's CE Church, Franklin; witnesses George Lloyd & Joseph Thorp. <sup>7</sup>
June 1852	Mustered in Huon district, resident with husband at Franklin. <sup>8</sup>
21 July 1852	Husband Charles Livingstone charged at Franklin with assault on Henry Bart; fined £4. <sup>9</sup>
27 July 1852	Ticket-of-Leave granted. <sup>10</sup>
c28 September 1852	Absconded from her authorised place of residence at Franklin. <sup>11</sup>
25 October 1852	Husband Charles Livingstone collected Certificate of Freedom. <sup>9</sup>
December 1852	Mustered in Huon district, resident at Hospital Bay. <sup>8</sup>
14 November 1854	<b>Daughter</b> Eliza Livingstone born; baptised 19 December 1854 at St Joseph's RC Church, Hobart; sponsors Thomas Martin & Ann Mack. <sup>12</sup>
28 December 1855	Free by servitude.
4 November 1856	Certificate of Freedom sent to Kingston for collection. <sup>10</sup>
29 January 1857	<b>Daughter</b> Mary Livingstone, tailor's child, born in Franklin district. <sup>13</sup>
