20 July 1840            Charged at Gloucester, Gloucestershire, England with breaking into a dwelling house of Ann Hampton at Woodmancote, Bishop's Cleeve on 17 July and stealing a quantity of tea and other articles; also with breaking into the dwelling house of William Crook; committed for trial.<sup>3</sup>

                              Admitted to Gloucester Gaol, Gloucestershire, England; aged 14, 'remarkable grey hair from a fever and a fright', grey eyes, round visage, fresh complexion, read imperfectly, labourer, native of Bishop's Cleeve.<sup>3</sup>

15 August 1840        Tried at the County Assizes, Gloucestershire, England indicted on 3 counts of housebreaking; sentence 10 years transportation.<sup>4</sup>

                              Newspaper report:  
                              *Jane Taylor, 14, charged with breaking open the dwelling-house of Ann Hampton, on the 17<sup>th</sup> of July, at Woodmancote, and stealing 3s. N money, and some wearing-apparel, the property of Mary Ann Hampton, was found guilty, and sentenced to six months' hard labour at Northleach.*

*Jane Taylor, who was yesterday tried for housebreaking, and sentenced to six months' hard labour, was again placed at the bar, charged with breaking open the dwelling-house of William Crook, on 19<sup>th</sup> July, at Bishop's Cleeve, and stealing various articles; she was again found guilty. There was another indictment against her for a smaller offence, but on this she was not tried. Sentence, ten years' transportation.<sup>5</sup>*

18 August 1840        Removed from Gloucester Gaol, Gloucestershire, England; conduct orderly.<sup>3</sup>

5 April 1841            Departed Woolwich, England on the *Rajah*.<sup>6</sup>

19 July 1841            Arrived at Hobart on the *Rajah*.<sup>6</sup>

c24 July 1841           Upon arrival at Hobart, sent to Cascades Female Factory; not fit for assignment, invalid.<sup>7</sup>

- 31 December 1841 Mustered in the service of Mr Watchorn, Hobart.<sup>8</sup>
- 10 April 1843 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart on complaint of her master with misconduct in absenting herself without leave from the service of Mrs Perkins, Brisbane Street, Hobart; plea guilty; reprimanded and discharged.<sup>9</sup>  
Ann Gale (*Royal Admiral*) charged with the same offence; in the service of Mr Watchorn, Liverpool Street, Hobart; sentence 48 hours in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, then returned to her service.<sup>9</sup>
- 28 August 1843 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart on the complaint of her mistress Mrs Nathan, Liverpool Street, Hobart with repeated insolence; plea guilty; reprimanded.<sup>10</sup>
- 18 November 1843 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by her mistress Mrs Nathan with disobedience of orders and insolence this morning; plea guilty; sentence 6 days in solitary confinement at Cascades Female Factory, then returned to her service.<sup>11</sup>
- 15 December 1843 Charged at the Police Court, Hobart by her master with misconduct in being absent without leave; in the service of Mr Watchorn, Liverpool Street, Hobart; sentence 1 month hard labour in the separate working rooms at Cascades Female Factory.<sup>12</sup>
- 22 February 1844 Classified as a 2<sup>nd</sup> class probation pass-holder; gazetted 23 February.<sup>13</sup>
- 27 February 1844 Classified as a 3<sup>rd</sup> class probation pass-holder; gazetted 1 March.<sup>14</sup>
- 12 June 1844 Application for permission to marry Richard Williams<sup>15</sup> (free) sent to the Muster Master and the Secretary; approved.<sup>16</sup>
- 20 June 1844 Notice given of approval for permission to marry Richard Williams; Jane in private service at Hobart; Richard free.<sup>17</sup>
- 8 July 1844 **Married** Richard Williams at Trinity Anglican Church, Hobart; Jane aged 21, spinster, illiterate; Richard aged 28, carpenter, widower, illiterate; witnesses William Mathews and Elizabeth Williams.<sup>18</sup>
- 31 July 1844 Hired in private service as a probation pass-holder to Robert Hart, Elizabeth Street, Hobart.<sup>19</sup>
- 31 August 1844 Promoted from a 2<sup>nd</sup> class to a 3<sup>rd</sup> class<sup>20</sup> probation pass-holder; gazetted 6 September.<sup>21</sup>
- 1 November 1845 Ticket of Leave granted; gazetted 4 November.<sup>22</sup>
- 14 February 1847 **Daughter** Elizabeth Williams born at Hobart; informant father Richard Williams, tanner, illiterate, resident of Elphinstone Street, Hobart.<sup>23</sup>

14 November 1848	Ticket of Leave revoked. <sup>4</sup>
4 January 1849	Petitioned for remission of sentence. <sup>4</sup>
21 February 1849	Petition for remission of sentence refused. <sup>4</sup>
