20 April 1849	Received at Grangegorman Depot, Dublin at 9am. ²
29 January 1850	Contracted as PPH to Charles Callaghan, Argyle St, Hobart, 12m at £8 pa. ³
27 March 1850	Absconded from the service of Charles Callaghan, Argyle St, Hobart. ⁴
9 April 1850	Tried at Hobart PC charged with absence without leave from the service of Charles Callaghan, Argyle St, Hobart from 26 March until 1 April when apprehended in the house of a man named Grimsham in Norfolk Place, Hobart; sentence 7m HL, Cascades FF, recommended to be hired in the interior. ⁵
26 February 1851	Application for permission to marry Thomas Bridgeman (<i>Susan</i> 2); referred 1 March PM Huon & 4 March Revd E Freeman. ⁶
29 April 1851	Contracted as PPH to Alexander Goldie, Coal River, 12m at £9 pa. ⁷
7 June 1851	Mustered in Ross district. ¹⁰
8 January 1852 ^b	Illegitimate daughter Ann Tully born at Ross FF; baptised 12 January at Ross FF; sponsor Caroline Rankin (<i>qv</i>). ⁸
25 October 1852	Sponsor at baptism of Thomas Murphy, son of Jane Murphy & Thomas Brady, at Ross FF. ⁹
28 October 1852	To Adam Jackson, <i>Williamswood</i> , Campbell Town. ¹⁰
26 January 1853	Application for permission to marry George Wolfe (<i>Barossa</i> 2) (approved 1 February ^c). ¹¹
1 February 1853	Husband-to-be George Wolfe charged at Ross with being drunk, resisting a constable & tearing his coat; fined 5s, 20s & to pay 5s for damages. ¹²
28 February 1853	Married as 24y, house servant, spinster, to George Wolfe, 23y, shepherd, bachelor, at St John's CE Church, Ross; witnesses Owen Leonard & William Middleton. ¹³
7 June 1853	Ticket-of-Leave granted. ¹⁰
4 August 1853	Daughter Elizabeth Wolfe born in Ross district; baptised 19 February 1854 at Campbell Town; sponsors Owen Leonard & Sarah Ritchie. ¹⁴
13 December 1853	Husband George Wolfe granted Conditional Pardon. ¹²

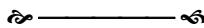

13 March 1855	Son George Wolfe born in Campbell Town district; baptised 1 May 1856 in Campbell Town district; sponsors William Roote & Alice Roote. ¹⁵
19 March 1856	Free by servitude.
12 August 1856	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with disturbing the public peace in a street at Campbell Town on 11 August; fined 5s; fine paid. ¹⁶
24 October 1856	Daughter Susan Wolfe, shepherd's child, born at Campbell Town; baptised 4 November 1856 in Campbell Town district; sponsor Father John Joseph Fitzgerald. ¹⁷
25 May 1858	Son Solomon Wolfe, shepherd's child, born at <i>Morning Side</i> ; baptised 18 October 1858 in Campbell Town district; sponsor Anne Wolfe. ¹⁸
5 June 1858	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with using indecent language in a public place at Campbell Town on 4 June; fined 5s; fine paid. ¹⁹
1 October 1858	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with using indecent language in a street in Campbell Town on 30 September; fined 5s; fine paid. ¹⁹
4 October 1858	Husband George Wolfe tried at Campbell Town PC, brought up from 30 September on remand, charged with having at Campbell Town on 29 September feloniously stolen 12s the property of Stephen Ford; discharged. ²⁰
2 November 1858	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with disturbing the public peace & using indecent language in a street at Campbell Town on 1 November; fined 5s for each offence; fine paid. ¹⁹
22 November 1858	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with using indecent language in a public place at Campbell Town on 21 November; fined 5s; fine paid. ¹⁹
25 November 1858	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with being drunk & incapable of taking care of herself in a street at Campbell Town on 24 November; fined 10s; fine not paid, 24h SC, Campbell Town Gaol (discharged 26 November, fine paid). ²¹ Husband George Wolfe tried at Campbell Town PC charged with being drunk & disorderly in a street in Campbell Town on 24 November; fined 10s. ²¹
3 January 1859	Husband George Wolfe tried at Campbell Town PC charged with violently assaulting his wife Ann Wolfe by kicking her in the face at Campbell Town on 1 January; sentence 6m HL, Launceston Gaol. ²⁰ Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with disturbing the public peace in a street of Campbell Town on 3 January; fined 5s; fine paid. ¹⁹
9 February 1859	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with using indecent language in a street in Campbell Town on 8 February; fined 5s; fine paid. ¹⁹
4 May 1859	Tried at Campbell Town PC charged with larceny under the value of £5 in having at Campbell Town on 14 May feloniously stolen 2 lbs meat, value 1s, 3 lbs sugar, value 4s per lb, & ¼ lb tea, value 6p, property of James Mullins; consents to be tried by 2 justices; sentence 2m HL, Launceston Gaol. ¹⁹
15 May 1859	To Campbell Town Gaol. ²²
21 May 1859	To Launceston Gaol under police escort from Campbell Town PO by day coach; sentence 2m HL. ²³
14 March 1862	Tried at Longford PC with Joseph Purcell (<i>Maria Somes</i>) charged with being suspected persons in frequenting a public place at Perth at 2 o'clock for the purpose of committing a felony; both sentences 14d HL, Launceston Gaol (discharged w/e 29 March). ²⁴
7 October 1862	Tried at Longford PC charged with being a suspected person to commit a felony in a public house in Perth yesterday; sentence 2m HL, Launceston Gaol (discharged w/e 29 November). ²⁴
28 December 1865	Charged at 7:30pm Port Sorell PO with husband George Wolfe, labourer for Mr Wedge of Forth, & son George Wolfe with larceny under the value of £5 in stealing at Forth on 26 December a purse containing 1 sovereign, 2s & 6p, monies of Catherine O'Neill of Forth; remanded to 3 January; discharged. ²⁵
26 February 1866	Son David Wolfe, labourer's child, born at Forth. ²⁶

- 24 March 1866 Charged at Port Sorell PO with husband George Wolfe, labourer for Mr Wedge of Forth, with being drunk & disturbing the peace in a public place at Leith on 7 March; each fined 10s, in default 48h SC, fines paid.²⁷
- 14 March 1868 **Daughter** Mary Wolfe, labourer's child, born at River Don.²⁸
- 19 April 1870 Charged at 6pm at Port Sorell PO, housewife, resident at Forth, with being drunk & disorderly in a public place at Forth on 19 April; fined 10s, in default 24h SC, fine paid.²⁹
- 11 October 1870 Husband George Wolfe, labourer for James Smyth of Forth, charged at 9:30pm at Port Sorell PO with being drunk & incapable of taking care of himself at the Forth on 11 October; property of 1 knife, 1 box of matches & 6p; fined 5s, fine paid.³⁰
- 12 November 1870 Charged at 4pm Port Sorell PO with being drunk & disturbing the peace in a public place at Forth on 12 November; fined 5s, in default 24h SC, fine paid.²⁹
- 6 September 1871 Husband George Wolfe, labourer for James Filluel of Forth, charged at 8pm at Port Sorell PO with being drunk & incapable of taking care of himself in a public place at Forth on the night of 6 September; property of 1 knife; fined 10s, in default 24h SC, fine not paid.³⁰
- 25 November 1871 Charged at 3am at Port Sorell PO with being drunk & disorderly in a public place at Forth on the morning of 25 November; fined 5s, in default 24h SC, fine paid.²⁹
- c1872 **Son** Thomas Wolfe born.³¹
- 19 July 1872 Charged at 2:30pm at Port Sorell PO with being drunk & disorderly in a public place at Forth on 19 July 1872; fined 5s, in default 24h SC, fine paid.²⁹
- 23 January 1874 Charged at 3:30pm at Port Sorell PO with making use of obscene language in a public place at Forth on 23 January; fined 5s, in default 24h SC, fine paid.³²
- Husband George Wolfe, labourer for JG Jordan of Forth, charged at 3:30pm at Port Sorell PO with being drunk & disturbing the peace in a public place at Forth on 23 January; fined 10s, in default 24h SC, fine paid.³²
- 12 November 1879 Son David Wolfe, farmer's child, 14y, died of inflammation of kidney & disease of the heart at Forth.³³
- 17 August 1883 Tried at Forth PC with husband George Wolfe, tailor, charged with larceny; sentences 3m HL each, Launceston Gaol (discharged w/e 21 November with husband George Wolfe).³⁴
- 9 January 1884 Tried at Forth PC, laundress, charged with inciting a prisoner to resist police; sentence 3w HL, Torquay Gaol (discharged w/e 6 February).³⁵
- Husband George Wolfe tried at Forth PC, tailor, charged with resisting police & obscene language; fined 10s or 3d imprisonment.³⁵
- c5 April 1884 Tried at Forth PC, housewife, charged with disturbing the peace & using obscene language; fined £2, fine paid.³⁶
- 27 November 1884 **Died**, drowned in Forth River, 53y, labourer's wife.³⁷
- 29 November 1884 Inquest held at residence of George Wolfe, Forth; verdict 'Anne Wolfe met her death by drowning in the River Forth on the morning of Thursday the 27th November 1884 but that there is no evidence to show how she fell into the river.'³⁸
